A Comparative Approach
For centuries social and economic relations within the Atlantic space were dominated by slavery and the transatlantic slave trade from Africa to the Americas. By the slowly and arduously achieved end of this trade, slave labour in the Americas was replaced in many cases by other forms of coerced labour of African Caribbean people or Indian, Chinese, African or European immigrants. This book focuses on the transformation of societies after the slave trade and slavery in a comparative intercontinental perspective. It combines micro- and macro-historical approaches and looks at the agency of slaves, missionaries, abolitionists, state officials, seamen and soldiers.

Taking Sukumaland in Tanzania as a reference, this book explores British colonial ideas about rural "development" and examines the results of their application after 1945. Colonial attempts to change African systems of agriculture are discussed extensively and critically assessed. Other issues like the exploitative character of British colonial development policy in the postwar period, the role of cooperatives, and the connection between development policy and decolonisation are also addressed.

Apartheid posed profound challenges to the conceptions of humanity and development that dominated the world stage after World War II. Embroiled analyses the manner in which international religious organisations dealt with the formulation and implementation of apartheid. It studies this question through an examination of the Swiss Mission in South Africa (SMSA), an institution that acted in South Africa, Switzerland and the international ecumenical community. As socially embedded institution, the SMSA mirrored divisions present within Swiss and South African societies on the issue of apartheid.

Politics in Kenya Since 1950
The book provides an overview of the troubled process of nation-building in post-colonial Kenya. Despite the distinctive features of the Moi and Kenyatta regimes, contributors make the case that since the late colonial period continuity, and not change, has been the dominant theme in Kenyan political life. Through a range of methodological lenses and empirical material, the chapters highlight different aspects of this continuity: the strength of the provincial administration, the weakness of formal party structures, the central role of ethnicity in shaping political competition, the understanding of the state as a resource in itself, and the ultimately incompatible beliefs held by different communities regarding how power can be legitimately exercised. Taken together, the persistence of these factors over time helps to explain the failure of the nation-building project in Kenya, and the context within which disputed elections in late-2007 could lead to the collapse of political order and the deaths of over 1,000 Kenyans.

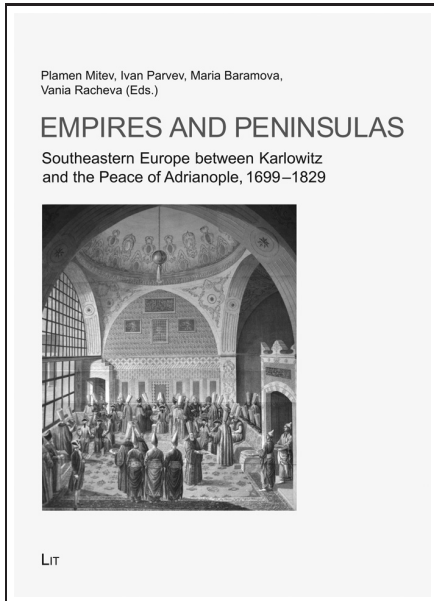

 Three powerful empires – the Habsburg, the Ottoman and
 the Russian – spent the 18th and the first third of the 19th
 centuries fighting each other for power and influence in the
 Balkans. This is not, however, the only significant aspect
 of the complicated history of the European Southeast. The
 intellectual and economic currents that turned the 18th cen-
 tury into a key event in human civilisation were refracted
 through the prism of Balkan regionalism. The 130 years

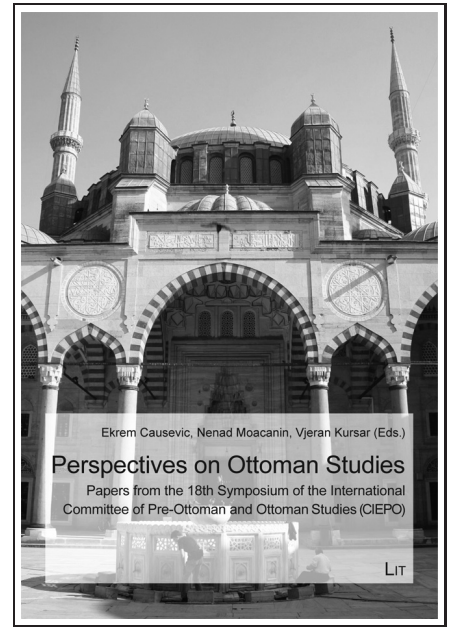

 Modern discourses on the social and cultural impact
 of Ottoman and Habsburg rule in Southeast Europe
 There has been a tendency to view the history of the Bal-
 kans as essentially determined by historical legacies. Whe-
 ther in scholarly literature or in popular discourse, the
 Ottoman or Habsburg pasts are thought to be accountable
 for a large variety of phenomena ranging from democra-
 tic culture (or the lack thereof) and adaptability to a free
 market economy to nepotism and the filthiness of public
 facilities. By contrast, the papers in this volume demonstrate
 that “legacies” are not unchanging determinants. Instead,
 they are very much open to constant reinterpretations and
 re-assessments depending on conditions in the present; they
 are, in short, as much shaped by the present as they are by
 the past.
